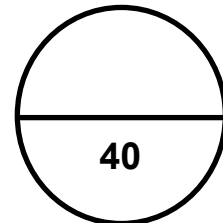

- 6 The tiny men, who looked like medium-sized dolls, were staring back across the river at the visitors.
“They can’t be real people,” Augustus said.
“Of course, they are real people,” Mr Wonka answered. “They’re Oompa-Loompas!”
