

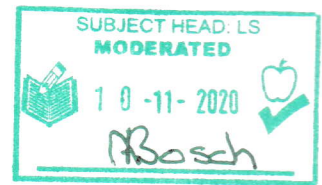

What is Coronavirus and how can we prevent it?

Coronavirus is a communicable disease that was first found in Wuhan City, China 2019. The disease has a huge impact on the world's health and the population. As on the 10th of November there were 50.8 million confirmed positive cases worldwide, 33.2 million people that recovered of the disease and 1.26 million people that passed away from it. This disease is caused by a virus that infects humans when they come in close contact with one another and the bacteria spreads. There is no known vaccine for this virus yet, but a professor, named Andrew Pollard, believes the vaccine will be ready by the end of the 2020 year. According to the WHO (World Health Organisation) the incubation period for someone who tested positive for Covid-19, is 10 days. The symptoms can be mild or severe depending on the individual's health condition. The symptoms can be identified as a runny nose, high fever, headache, coughing, nausea, chest pain, lost of taste and smell, tiredness diarrhea and sore throat; this means that the person should avoid any contact with people around them and rest for the 10 days in order for them to get better. In order for us to keep safe and protect our families we need to practice social distancing, sanitize our hands, wear masks and wash our hands regularly with soap and water.
