Pregnant accused's appeal

Chevon Booysen

A MURDER accused in the Ezra Daniels case yesterday appealed to the Wynberg Magistrate's Court to move her to the hospital wing of Pollsmoor Prison as she is pregnant.

Kelly Daniels's legal representative Carl Langevelt made the request on her behalf, which the court needed time to consider.

Langevelt said Kelly is "quite far along in her pregnancy".

She is one of five people accused of the murder of 7-year-old Ezra who was shot in Abdulla Moosa Road in Parkwood on Sunday afternoon.

Ezra was playing outside when he was caught in crossfire in an alleged gang-related shooting.

The suspects are Kelly, Cassiem Bianchi, Ikhraam Bianchi, Marlon Neehuis and Kimberley Solomons.

They are expected back in court on September 14 for bail applications.

Parkwood residents came out in their numbers yesterday, calling for no bail. They packed the courtroom and hallway.

Community worker and activist Paul Phillips said residents had had enough, referring to a riot last Sunday after Ezra was killed.

Police vehicles were damaged and two officers were assaulted during the incident.

"The space he was in was supposed to be a safe space.

"Our children should be allowed to play in the streets and parks. Gangs have taken over these spaces," Phillips said.

Ezra was shot metres away from the spot where another youngster was killed in February last year.

Jayden Boltman, 10, was shot

when gunmen ran through his home, opening fire and killing the youngster.

Boltman's father was shot in the leg.

Another organisation supporting the call for no bail for the murder accused was Iitha Labantu, based in Gugulethu.

The organisation handed over a memorandum that calls for "harsher punishment for the killers of Ezra".

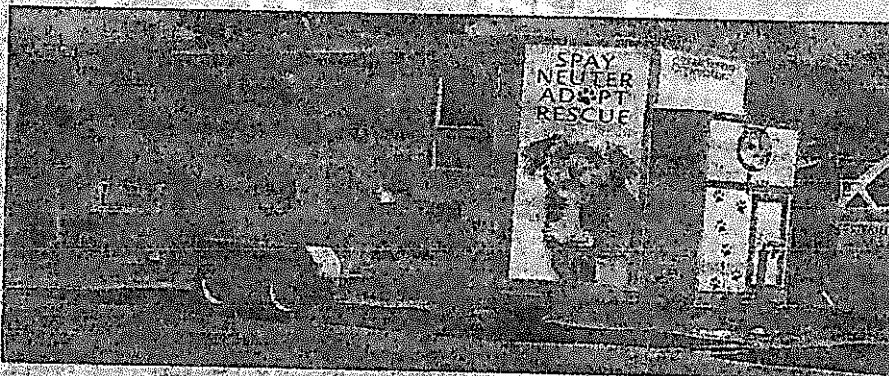
